We will have basic NARFE-PAC lapel pins available at our March membership meeting. Your support helps prepare our legislative and political affairs staff to beat back attempts to break promises made to current federal employees and retirees. Smaller cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) and higher health insurance costs as mentioned in last month's newsletter are examples.

NARFE-PAC also sent me to a Tacoma fund raising event last summer for our Sixth Congressional District Representative, Derek Kilmer. Derek is a fed-friendly lawmaker. He is the sponsor of the Federal Retirement Fairness Act, see the NARFE "Bill Tracker" in our March magazine on page 14.

Concerning the Russian invasion of Ukraine, this is a big deal. It will probably sideline a lot of our current legislative efforts. The most immediately noticeable effect, other than our daily news, will be inflation. Ukraine is a major producer of wheat and corn; it is a major supplier of precious metals for industry; and, of course, events there impact the price of oil which is now over \$100 a barrel. Expect inflation to hit 10 percent for 2022.

Our March membership meeting has Derek Kilmer scheduled to attend and be our speaker. So mark your calendar and attend our meeting to get an upto-the-moment status from our own congressional representative.

LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Last month I stated that we would talk about some legislative issues, and we will. I have found, somewhat to my embarrassment, that I have not stayed current on all of the issues. Everything that I will cover here is found in the *NARFE Magazine* "Bill Tracker".

H.R. 4351 "Fair Cola for Seniors Act" requires Social Security and federal retirement programs to use the Consumer Price Index for the Elderly (CPI-E) to calculate cost-of-living adjustments (COLAs) to retirement benefits. We have found that CPI-E has always been higher because the basket of goods used to compute the rate is more accurate for seniors than for the CPI-W.

The other issue I would like to address is the inability of Congress to pass timely appropriations bills, specifically the fiscal year 2022 appropriations legislation. Back when I joined NARFE and began tracking legislation, it was a rule made by Congress that this legislation would be passed no later than 1 October of the previous year, e.g., the start of the fiscal year. At the present time the schedule is for 11 March 2022.

Some call this "kicking the can down the road". Regardless, it leaves the federal government, seven months into a fiscal year, without an updated spending plan. This is not a good way to run a government.
