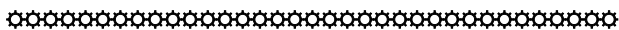
Program: Congressman Derek Kilmer Will Discuss National and Local Issues

This month's guest speaker is Congressman Derek Kilmer. He is our 6th Congressional District Representative in Congress. In January the United States reached its statutory debt limit of \$31.4 trillion and since then the US Treasury has been taking extraordinary measures to pay government obligations. With that and a divided Congress as background, debt limit negotiations will be front and center for the coming months. In the last two newsletter issues I listed NARFE's top five priorities that our lobbyists are advocating for on Capitol Hill. Many of our priorities are carry-over issues.

Last month our guest speaker was our NARFE Washington State Federation (WSF) President, Cray Henry. He is campaigning for a strong NARFE advocacy presence on Capitol Hill plus he explained

that, with budget negotiations, there are winners and losers. We do not want to lose our benefits we worked so hard to attain. It is our job to keep our membership strong. The more members an organization has, the stronger their position. If we want to keep our earning, health and retirement benefits, we have to work toward that goal. That includes recommending NARFE membership to co-workers, friends, and family so we can reverse the current membership decline. It is also important to attend this month's chapter meeting and let our guest speaker, Congressman Kilmer, know your concerns in the current budget negotiations. Like our WSF President said, there are winners and losers in budget negotiations. If we keep our current benefits and don't lose any of the ground we have worked so hard to attain, we will be winners.

MEMBERSHIP & MUSINGS

This is the membership report for the month of May. I have nothing terribly exciting to report. I would like to mention the continuing decrease in

membership and chapters, not just in Washington State but across the country. Don't forget, we are all recruiters and we should not pass up the opportunity to get a new member. Every *NARFE Magazine* has an application page.

The membership report will cover 23 March through 20 April. As this goes to print, we currently have 410 members in the chapter. Three members were dropped for nonrenewal this month: Patricia Cassiday, Emily Hatt and Leslie Malhiot. If you know any of these members, please urge them to renew their membership. One member passed away: Rodney Carlson. Our condolences to the family. And we have one new prospective member: Raldolph Rolle. We hope that you will join our chapter.

Now for the legislative corner. Senator Sherrod Brown, D-OH, and Senator Susan Collins, R-ME, reintroduced the Senate version of the "Social Security Fairness Act," S. 597. This bill would fully repeal the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP) and Government Pension Offset (GPO). It has 38 cosponsors and was assigned to the Committee on Senate Finance. Remember House Resolution 82? This companion bill, H.R. 82, has 232 cosponsors and languishes in the House Committee on Ways and Means.

Our next piece of legislation does not appear to get the recognition that I think that it deserves. "Saving the Civil Service Act," H.R. 1002, was introduced in the House by Representative Gerry Connolly, D-VA and the bill now resides in the House Oversight and Accountability committee with eleven cosponsors. Senator Tim Kaine, D-VA, submitted a companion bill in the Senate, S. 399, where it has 15 cosponsors. This legislation would prevent the return of schedule F, a statutory loophole created by the previous administration that would allow federal jobs to be converted to political appointments, the old spoils system.

Neither H.R. 1002 nor S. 399 are cosponsored by any Washington State congressional representatives. Please take this opportunity to ask your senators and representative to cosponsor these bills.

Texting scam – A recent article in the April AARP Bulletin (pgs. 7 & 8) describes how you might receive a text from a number you don't recognize. The text seems urgent so you respond to the sender that they texted the wrong number. “The scammer – or often an automated chatbot that sends out computer-generated messages – keeps up the friendly texts.”

I received a text like this where the sender, after several texts, provided their name and age, perhaps an invitation for me to do the same. I deleted the thread and blocked the number. The AARP article notes that “Scammers are primarily aiming to find phone numbers where people are willing to engage.”

It's unfortunate, but it's no longer safe to be polite or helpful in this situation. Delete texts from numbers you don't recognize; never click on links within the texts; and don't respond with “STOP” when offered that option. Instead, delete the text and block the number.
