WEP/GPO LEGISLATION STATUS President Bill Powers

The Social Security Fairness Act, H.R. 82/S. 597, would repeal the Government Pension Offset (GPO) and the Windfall Elimination Provision (WEP). Much attention has been given to this subject over the past 40 years and NARFE is presently pushing for an up or down vote in the House of Representatives. Both senators and nine out of our ten Washington State representatives are cosponsors of this bill. A bipartisan effort to advance H.R. 82 to a House vote was successful.

A discharge petition signed by 218 legislators is required to force House Speaker Mike Johnson to schedule a vote on the Social Security Fairness Act H.R. 82. This was accomplished with seven* of our ten legislators signing the discharge petition. There is a one-week "layover period" following petition success. However, this pushed the vote into the October recess period in anticipation of the 2024 election cycle. The earliest that H.R. 82 could be called up for a vote is in November. November and December are called the lame duck session because representatives, such as Derek Kilmer whose term ends 3 January 2025, chose not to run for reelection.

Even if the House successfully votes to pass the measure, the bill's sponsors will find an uphill battle in the Senate. The Senate version, S. 597, has 63 cosponsors. This is enough to break the filibuster; however, the Senate will only have 24 working days before the end of the 118th Congress on 3 January 2025. This is due to the Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's holidays.

If passed by both the House and Senate, this will be a huge and well-deserved success for both NARFE and the bipartisan Problem Solving Caucus.

H.R. 1002, Saving the Civil Service Act, is legislation that was introduced in February 2023 by Representative Gerald Connolly (D-VA) and has been referred to the House Committee on Oversight and Accountability. The legislation would generally prohibit changes to the classification of positions in the excepted service unless certain conditions are met. This is known as Schedule F. It appears that OPM has made new rules concerning Schedule F, precluding the need for the legislation currently.

Now we will get on with this month's membership report. Bremerton Chapter 0181 now has 363 members, a loss of 33 members over the last 12 months.
