With the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) continuing to be a hot topic in our daily news, NARFE's actions to counter emerging threats to federal services are ongoing. Chiefly among these, NARFE filed a lawsuit to block implementation of Schedule F, now called Schedule P/C (Policy/Career). This executive action is an attempt to ignore merit based civil service protections and implement a spoils system for political supporters. As stated in our April newsletter, Schedule P/C would take civil service back to the early 1880s when each incoming administration would fire employees willy-nilly and replace them based on patronage incoming administration. administration will do this by reclassifying employees into at-will positions through the

new Schedule P/C. At-will positions would not have civil service protections. All senior executive service members and congressional leaders agree that aspects of civil service reform are needed but differ on implementation. As NARFE, we can push back against threats and work to ensure federal employees and retirees are treated fairly.

President Trump has taken up the "Move Fast & Break Things" practice that some dot-com tech sector startup businesses have used. Prime Minister Viktor Orban of Hungary, an eastern European Union (EU) affiliate, has been practicing this policy. Now in his fourth term, he started his candidacy by stating he would government and eliminate restructure corruption and inefficiencies. He then started eliminating his enemies followed by eliminating news media bias. He now controls the government via the National Assembly whose majority party reelects him with EU support vanguished. Populous districts have been gerrymandered by the National Assembly so

that fewer votes are required to maintain control.

He is slowly hollowing out and destroying democracy in his country and brought clashes with the EU so they cut funding to Hungary over rule-of-law concerns. We do not want this scenario. It seems to me, if something like this continues, it may have a negative impact on Social Security or healthcare.

NARFE PAC contributions for the first quarter 1/1/2025 thru 3/31/2025 for the 119th Congress: Bremerton Chapter members contributed \$1,524.84 from 18 contributors with 5 sustainers (members who set up automatic contributions from either a credit card or their annuity). All Washington State Chapters contributed \$6,140.10 from contributors with 22 sustainers. Washington National-only members contributed \$5,080.50 from 61 contributors with 6 sustainers. Grand Total contributions from NARFE members \$252,558.40 from 4,078 contributors with 547 sustainers.

Tariffs & Stocks

President Trump has long been an advocate of tariffs and imperialism. He was advocating for them prior to his first term in office and considers tariffs a short-term solution to the long-term problem of America's reliance on imports. We are a consumer nation, more so than any other nation, so import/export trade is big business. A previous president who raised protective tariffs was William McKinley, the 25th president (1897 to 1901); he campaigned on imperialism and protectionism. Trump admires the fact that McKinley realigned the Republican Party to become dominant in the early 20th century. During his presidency, the United States acquired Hawaii, Guam, and Puerto Rico and became a leader in manufacturing by raising tariffs on imported goods. McKinley's imperialism explains Trump's desire for Greenland.

Some tariffs are considered good to promote jobs in a depressed area of our country. They are slightly inflationary but considered a positive in the long run. Other tariffs don't create jobs; they only cause inflation because the country where these items are made is a very poor country and does not reciprocate trade.

The present tariff problem is the on-again-off-again yo-yo effect plus the trade war with China. Manufacturers and stock market traders do not like uncertainty. Therefore, we are experiencing huge swings in the Dow Jones Industrial Average, Nasdaq Composite, and Standard & Poor's 500. Due to this uncertainty, some businesses are thinking of opening warehouses outside the United States. Also, toy manufacturers must put in their manufacturing orders for Christmas way ahead of the holiday season since most toys are made outside the US. Some wholesalers are saying toy store shelves will be empty by Halloween.

In his first term, President Trump nominated Jerome Powell as Chairman of the Federal Reserve. Powell and his constituents have been fighting inflation, which is one of the two key items Trump ran on for presidency. Then Trump came out saying that Powell was doing a horrible job and wanted to fire him because Powell would not advocate lowering the prime interest rate. This and controlling the money supply are the two main tools the Fed uses to fight inflation. When Trump rescinded his remarks, it caused another huge upward swing in the stock market
